Māori Language Week 14-21 Sept

Poetry Competition Winner

Russley Writers' Club students worked incredibly hard on their entries for an international poetry contest, **Given Words Poetry Competition.** Poems had to include the five 'given words': *feather, whisper, eat, time, phantasmagoria* and were sent to Spain, where one of the judges is based. We were excited to learn that from 148 entries, poems from four Russley students made the list of Best Poems by under-16s. In addition, one of our students was a prize-winner.


